THE IMPACT OF ABORTION IN BLACK AMERICA

Since 1965, almost a decade before Roe v. Wade (1973), there have been nearly two dozen U.S. Supreme Court rulings institutionalizing abortion on demand in America. [01, 02]

Since 1967 abortion on demand has taken over 56 million lives. Over 20 million of those lives are Black Americans. [03, 04]

56 million lives is equal to the population of America's 82 largest cities and 20 million is half the current U.S. Black population of 40 million. [05]

Since 1973 abortion on demand in Black America has taken more lives than Homicides, Heart Disease, Diabetes, Cancer, and/or HIV/AIDS combined and become the #1 Cause of Death in the Black community. [06]

Currently in the United States, abortions on demand are declining by just 1% a year. [07]

At that rate, it would take over 60 years to cut the number of abortions on demand by 50% and over 200 years to end it. [08]

If we don't change the current rate of decline in abortions, while abortion on demand will still be with us 200 years from now, America won't be. [09]



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According the Alan Guttmacher Institute (AGI) 30% of all abortions are performed on Black women. [10]

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 35% of all abortions are performed on Black women. [11, 12]

However, Black Americans make up only 14% of the U.S. population. [13]

That's 14% of the U.S. population responsible for 30% to 35% of all abortions on demand in the United States of America.

If you consider half of us are women that number drops down to about 7% of the U.S. population.

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If you consider childbearing age (from 15-44) that number drops down to 3% of the U.S. population. [14, 15]

That's 3% of the U.S. population responsible for 30% to 35% of all abortions on demand in the United States of America.

While nationally abortions on demand are declining by 1.3% a year, the abortion rate for Black Women has increased by 4.1%. [16, 17]



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Again, according to the CDC the abortion rate for Black women has increased from 481 abortions per 1,000 live births in 2007 to 501 in 2009. [18]

The Black American teenage abortion rate is 41 per 1,000 women among

15 to 19 year-olds and is higher than any other racial group. [19]

Today, Black American teenage pregnancies have the greatest chance of resulting in abortion than any other racial group. [20]

If you consider the data surrounding abortion on demand in Black America and the research surrounding preterm birth rates, you'll discover that Black women have 3x the risk of an early preterm birth (EPB) and 4x the risk of an extreme preterm birth (XPB) as non-Black women. [21]

Right now, to give us some perspective on the impact of abortion on demand in the Black community ... according to the archives of the Tuskegee Institute, from 1882 to 1968 (86 years) the Ku Klux Klan lynched 3,446 Negroes. [22]

What took the Ku Klux Klan 86 years to accomplish ... abortion on demand in Black America accomplishes in less than 4 days. [23, 24]



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In 1970, Louisiana State Judge Leander Perez said: “The best way to hate a nigger is to hate him before he is born.” [25, 26, 27]

Today, Louisiana State Judge Leander Perez's dream has come true.

Right now there are 1.54 Black Abortions for every death in Black America regardless of the cause of death. [28]

In other words, for every 100 Black Americans who die from all other causes of death, there are 154 Black Babies aborted. [29]

To put it still another way, there are 54% more Black Abortions than Black deaths from all other causes of death in Black America. [30]

The facts are clear now and the numbers don't lie.

Abortion on demand in Black America is a holocaust.

And in light of the data surrounding botched abortions by abortion providers all across the country and the THREE (3) 1ST DEGREE GUILTY OF MURDER VERDICTS in the Gosnell murder trial in Philadelphia, it's easy to see that Dr. Kermit Gosnell is not only the face of BIG Abortion but his cold, cruel, callus care and concern for Black women represents the heart and soul of the Abortion Industry.
