

## OBAMA'S ABORTION WAR ESCALATES ON BLACKS, BUT DO THEY CARE?

Infanticide champion Obama supports abortion that now kills black babies about 500 percent more often than white babies. And according to the [National Black Pro-Life Union](#), "ABORTION IS THE NUMBER ONE KILLER OF AFRICAN AMERICANS!!!" Does the black community care or even know?

For every 1,000 black women, there are 50 abortions, but among whites, it's 10.5 per 1,000 women, states academician and author Anne Hendershott in an Oct. 28 article—"A Dangerous Time to be a Black Baby"—at [Public Discourse](#).

Calling that statistic for blacks "alarming," she notes that in some places, including states such as Mississippi, Louisiana, Maryland, and Georgia, as well as New York City, "more than half of all abortions" are for black women. But in a 2003 piece at National Review Online, "[The Real Racial Disparities](#)," Hendershott indicated the actual number was at 47 percent in New York City.

Her 2008 assessment is that the grim data do not represent income inequality, as abortion-rightists would argue.

No, she suggests, it's from the rise of what she calls the "culture of abortion" in the American black community, because of the abortion facilities are as common in urban landscapes as the Dollar General or Dollar Tree or Dollar Whatever stores.

Day Gardner, who's founder and president of the Washington, D.C.-based National Black Pro-Life Union, also blames high rates on the sheer number of inner-city clinics that performed abortions.

"It [the high abortion rate in the black community] doesn't have as much to do with poverty as that the abortion facilities are there, ingrained in the neighborhoods," she said in an Oct. 28, 2008, [Los Angeles Times](#) story, "Abortion rate down, but report cites racial disparity."

"We as a community don't talk about this... . This is a silent killer among us," Gardner said.

Somebody in the black community, as well as white and even Hispanic communities, had better start talking. Especially how about some of the black communities leaders such as Colin Powell, Jesse Jackson, Al Sharpton, Charles Rangel, Jeremiah Wright and others?

To whom should they talk?

How about abortionist-in-chief Barack Hussein Obama, who received near-majority support from the blacks and overwhelming support from Hispanics, plus substantial support from whites?

Maybe, though, blacks are afraid to acknowledge how dangerous his support of abortion is?

Or unwilling to embrace that by championing abortion, he promotes a cultural practice that is killing them, the very community that gave him 96 percent of its vote?

Or too ill-informed to be outraged that for years he's been engaging in war against them, the same community of which he's so desperately tried all his life to be a part?

More grotesquely, perhaps blacks and their leaders don't care or might even support the practice?

Regardless, why don't they choose life, instead of death?
