

## How fatherlessness affects abortion

Two African-American pro-life groups, [The Radiance Foundation](#) and Walter Hoyer's [Issues4Life Foundation](#), have combined resources to launch a campaign in California that focuses on the "crisis of fatherlessness."

Radiance spokesman Ryan Bomberger tells OneNewsNow that the billboard and online "[Fatherhood begins in the womb](#)" campaign targets fatherlessness and how it is fostered through the culture of abortion by "highlighting some of the sobering statistics, where 41 percent of all children in our country are born to unmarried mothers. The significance of that is that 84 percent of women who have abortions are unmarried," he notes.

So, that means the country is dealing with a major crisis that is not only leading to the death of children in the womb, but also to the slow death of children "through child abuse, through higher [numbers of] school dropouts, through higher drug use, and through higher criminal activity because of the absence of fathers."

Bomberger points out that the moment a woman conceives a child, a father is born, as are the responsibilities of a father. But the campaign hopes to overcome the "culture of abandonment."

Sacramento, California's capital city, is the first to see the billboards. In that state, at least 214,190 children have been aborted within the last reported year.

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
