The governor said the measure did not fully satisfy him, but that he sympathized with the effort to revise the statute in force here for 106 years.

California will thus become the third and the largest state in the nation to make it easier for a woman to have a legal abortion when the law takes effect 90 days after the close of the legislative session. Colorado and North Carolina recently passed such laws.

Cambodia to Exchange Envoys with Hanoi


